For families in rural Cambodia living below the poverty line, it is difficult, on a daily basis, to provide food for the family.

Often parents are forced to take their children out of school to help find or grow food. Children as young as five years old will often help their parents on their farm.

This is why UWS builds gardens in some of our schools. In these gardens children and teachers grow sweetcorn, soyabeans, morning glory, and lemongrass.

These vegetables are then shared amongst the students and taken home to their families.


• Why do 80% of farmers in Cambodia grow rice?
